WE BELIEVE that BC Hydro is one of our province's proudest achievements, providing British Columbians with affordable, clean and reliable electric power for over 40 years.

WE BELIEVE that the revenue **BC Hydro contributes to health care, education and social programs** – more than \$1.7 billion in the last two years – is vital to our citizens' well being.

WE BELIEVE that public power gives consumers, industry and small business the **best possible electricity rates** – publicly-owned utilities in BC, Manitoba and Quebec provide the lowest-priced electricity in all of North America.

WE BELIEVE that the provincial government decision to rely on the private sector for new generation will **increase rates unnecessarily**.

WE BELIEVE that to continue to be successful, **BC Hydro must remain 100 percent publicly owned** and operated, not broken up into separate companies.

WE BELIEVE that British Columbia should stand up to the American Federal Energy Regulatory Commission [FERC], which is pushing for California-style deregulation of electricity, despite disastrous results and several American states reversing plans to move to a market system.

WE BELIEVE that **coal-fired generation of electricity is unnecessary** and that BC should promote conservation, efficiency, and renewable energy sources.

WE BELIEVE that the BC government's plan to break up and transfer one-third of BC Hydro to Bermuda-based Accenture would be a **terrible and permanent mistake**.

WE BELIEVE that all **MLA's must refuse to support any break-up or privatization of BC Hydro** – including voting against any legislation – so that all British Columbians can have the opportunity to participate in full public consultation in their own communities about the future of BC Hydro.
